You will find in this issue the "Mild in May" trail passport; please give it a look and hopefully go out and enjoy the delights that the pubs in the trail have to offer.

The style of beer known as Mild covers a number of very different beers from the lower strength ones up to some much stronger ones and ranging in hue from light coloured to dark deep reds verging on black. If mild is not a style of beer you have tried before then this is a chance to see if it is something you enjoy.

Due to problems finding a new venue for "Festival at the Edge" the event will not be taking place this year, so we will not need to supply the beer tent. It should be back in 2020. Planning is going ahead for the "Severn Valley Railway" Bridgnorth beer festival in September. Shifnal beer festival will be taking place at the War Memorial Club again in October.

Please support our pubs in the county because without your support we will lose more of them. Pubs are more than just drinking establishments, they are often the last place in a small town or village for people to get together for socials and events, so without them we lose more than just another pub.

Brewery News



Unk has been brewed again. This 7% brew met with acclaim at the recent Prince of Wales Beer Festival in Shrewsbury.

Corvedale Brewery

Four of their beers are no longer brewed. They are Farmer Ray's Ale, Fuggles Gold, Norman's Pride and Katie's Pride. They have been replaced with just one which is Bitter at 3.7% which Norman tells me is an amber-coloured beer with a refreshing, slightly hoppy taste and a bitter finish.

Finney's Brewery

Two new cask conditioned ales on sale in local pubs; WildSide and LightSide.

Hobsons Brewery

Seasonal beers will be available as follows: March / April – Hobsons 25 (4.4%) – an amber bitter April / May – Simco Chinnock (4.8%) – a black IPA.

The brewery collected 5 awards at the West Midlands CAMRA Regional awards extravaganza in December; see report later in this edition.

There are plans to open the visitor centre from Wednesdays to Thursdays as a brewery tap. Likely hours are to be 12 noon to 8pm (later when events are taking place).

Wye Valley Brewery

Won 2 National Beer Awards awards at SIBA BeerX

Joule's Brewery

Joules are going to produce a number of limited edition brews this year. Firstly they are starting with a Chocolate Stout that will be available over the Easter period this will run alongside the popular seasonal beer Shropshire Hop. During May they are going to brew a fruity Mild ale which is a first for the brewery. Later in the month there will be a Tropical IPA produced to welcome the beginning of summer followed in June by the return of Royal ale.

Joules have acquired The Cock Hotel in Wellington and the White Horse in Shrewsbury. Both of these pubs will be refurbished after the completion of the new development Joules are making in Stone their heritage home that will include a tap house, theatre and community centre.

Ludlow Brewery

A small brew plant has been installed and is now in operation. See later in this edition for the presentation made to the brewery.

They will have a core range of three beers - SVA, a blonde light ale, Cartway Gold, an amber ale and Old Mo, a hoppy IPA named after the ghost of an old monk said to haunt Bridgnorth. Bridgnorth Rugby Club and The George and Dragon Inn, Much Wenlock are reported to be taking some of the first batch.

Rowton Brewery

Rowton are trialling bottling their regular beers (Ironbridge Gold and Area 51) beer with the aim to sell it at local markets and farm shops, not on a large scale.

Salopian Brewery

New Seasonal beer - Fault Line 4.0%. New Black Range beer - Cico Buuf 6.9%, also available in cans. They won 2 National Beer Awards awards at SIBA BeerX

Six Bells Brewery

The loss of brewery personnel previously reported has lead to the hopefully temporary closure of the brewery with some beers being brewed off site.

The Rose & Crown and The Church Inn, Ludlow


On Saturday 15 June (National Beer Day) & Sunday 16th June these pubs holding their own celebration - The Ludlow Magna Carter.

How to use your passport

In each pub present your passport when you order a half or more of mild. The box for the pub will be marked. Once you have reached your target number of pubs then follow the instructions on the back of the passport.

Some pubs have been designated "Remote Pubs". Your target will include a small number of these pubs, many of which can be reached easily by public transport (www. travelline.info/).

Enjoy your mild but for more rural pubs please check ahead. The details for each pubs are correct at time of going to press, but please use the "WhatPub" website if you wish to confirm.

A line is included against each pub for you to note the mild offered on your visit, and you may wish to note the price and beer quality as well. Please use CAMRA scoring of 0-5, where "0" signifies no cask ale available and "5" the perfect pint. A reasonable beer in average condition should be rated "2½".





The Prince of Wales, Bynner Street, Belle Vue, Shrewsbury.

A welcoming two-roomed "back street local" which has a bowling green to the rear and is overlooked by a 19th Century former Maltings, it is a true community pub where darts, dominoes and bowls teams abound. Shrewsbury Town FC memorabilia adorn the building both inside and out, with some of the seating from the old Gay Meadow Ground skirting the bowling green. They hold two beer festivals each year, the Winter Ales Festival in February and another Festival in May as well as popular themed nights. Free of tie, the beer range has been increased to include regulars from Hobson's and Salopian alongside some nationally available ales and local quests such as Wood's and Stonehouse as well.

Our congratulations go to Vicky and Ian and the team for a well-deserved award, won against some very stiff competition from all around the branch area.

The Bailey Head Oswestry.

This former Marston's pub was renamed The Bailey Head and reopened under private ownership in March 2016.

Internally it has an L-shaped arrangement which caters for a bar, lounge, games area and a snug. The owners have a clear vision of what the pub ought to be with real ale very much a part of the offering. Grace and Duncan have created a pub that the community at large is able to enjoy.

Thus they welcome customers who may just want a comfortable interlude with a soft drink, a snack or a newspaper (or access to WiFi!) or indeed some quality time with a well behaved dog (the pub was voted Most Dog Friendly Pub in the West Midlands in 2017).

A glance at the pump clips on the ceiling in the bar will reflect the effort put into providing the customer with an interesting range of beer. Over 500 different cask beers are sold in a year. Also, the real ale offering is supplemented, not only by three carefully chosen key cask beers, but also by extensive and exciting menus of gin, rum, vodka and whisky. Regular 'Meet the Brewer' and tap take-over events have been established and we congratulate Grace, Duncan and the team on this award which was announced on the third birthday of their taking over the pub.

The Mytton Arms, Habberly, near Pontesbury.

To get to the Mytton Arms, there is no alternative other than negotiating the narrow lanes of South Shropshire, although in the summer the Shropshire Hills Shuttle Bus could help! Nevertheless, it is worth seeking out this well used village community pub. Its three low beamed rooms are cosy, comfortable and tastefully done out which, together with a friendly rustic atmosphere, make it a pretty tempting, quiet place to linger. It is quite close to popular local walks on the Stiperstones and Earls Hill, including Route 4 in the Walking with Offa series. A frequent award winner, here you will find beers from Hobsons and Three Tuns complemented by a couple of guest ales from other local breweries.

Three Tun Brewery

A small party were tasked with getting to Bishops Castle to present a certificate



in the West Midlands Regional Champion Beer of Britain 2018 competition. It was a Silver in the Best Bitter Category for their XXX . For this we used the unfortunately relatively infrequent bus service. Please note that if you attempt this journey you need to prepared to catch the "last" bus back to Shrewsbury at 3.40 p.m.! The recipient is their Head Brewer Steve and on his right is their Brewery Liaison Officer Martin Price

Ludlow Brewery

This presentation was fitted around a Public Transport Group outing to Leominster. On the way back instead of passing through Ludlow we got off with about an hour spare to call in at the Railway Shed the home of the Ludlow Brewery. This time we were presenting to Gary Walters to acknowledge Black Knight winning a Silver in the West Midlands Regional Championship Beer of Britain Stouts category. After the presentation we had time for a quick tour which allowed us to inspect the new micro brewery, put in for small batch test brewing.

Winter Pub of the Season winners from around the county:

The Bell & Talbot, Bridgnorth

Bridgnorth Sub-Branch has awarded the title "Pub of the Season" for Winter 2018 to the Bell & Talbot in Salop Street, Bridgnorth. The award is made 4 times per year to pubs which meet all the criteria for inclusion in the national Good Beer Guide but fail to make it because of lack of space.

The photograph shows Sub-Branch Secretary Alan Thwaites presenting the award to licensee Keith Lacey on 14th November. Keith has been leasing the pub from "Key the Clipper", the previous licensee, since 2015 and under his stewardship the pub has regained its previous reputation. There are 4 hand-pumps and, on the occasion of the presentation these were dispensing Batham's Bitter, Hobson's Town Crier, Wye Valley HPA and Salopian Oracle. With two open fires and a small snug as well as the main bar with sports TV and a pool-room, the pub caters for everyone. No food is served, but filled rolls are often on sale from the bar.



The Blood Bay, Ludlow

The Shrewsbury & West Shropshire Branch Pub of the Season (Winter 2018) Award has been presented to Ludlow's newest pub, and quite possibly one of the town's most intact late-19th century retail properties the Blood Bay.



A 9 month conservation project leaves period glazed mahogany room-divide screens - creating three defined drinking spaces: a public bar on entering from High Street, a tiny snug to the right, and a back bar - accessed from the public bar or from Market Street.

A Victorian curved mahogany bar, complemented by a back bar serving hatch, brass-mounted cut-glass ceiling lights, period seating with drinking ledges and authentic inset lignum vitae beer engines enable customers to experience what it may have been like to drink in one of the many long-gone Victorian pubs of Ludlow.

Some beers are produced by The Blood Bay's own brewing concern - Swan Walters & Son - Including India Pale and X Stout. They employ the same ingredients from source and authentic late-Victorian brewing practice as requested in the hand-written recipes. They aim to eventually brew all of the original Ludlow & Craven Arms recipes dated 1898, which include recipes for: XX Best Mild, Pale, Stout and AK Bitter.

The pub sign depicts the locally-owned blood bay horse 'Forba', the 1932 Grand National winner 'Forbra' - owned by the then-Ludlow mayor, William Parsonage.

Congratulations to Jon and the team for earning this well-deserved award.

The Compasses, Beveley

Our 2019 beer scoring trips started in earnest on the 3rd January on a sunny, crisp winter day out to Oakengates and surrounding areas. We started our trail at midday in the town before a short trek to the Compasses at Beveley.

Here we presented Mark Jenkins and his team with Telford branch 'Pub of the Season' for Winter. The bar is cosy with comfy sofas to lounge around in whilst enjoying a pint of their regular Salopian Hop Twister, or a guest beer which was Hobsons Town Crier. At the rear of the Compasses is Jenko's 'Mongolian barbecue' restaurant located in a log cabin and you can take your beer through to accompany your meal! Excellent company and good quality beer all day – a good start to the New Year. Congratulations to all at the Compasses and for your hospitality on the day.



Shropshire's Real Heritage Pubs Loggerheads, Shrewsbury

The National Inventory of Pubs with Interiors of Outstanding Historic Interest is CAMRA's pioneering effort to identify and help protect the most important historic pub interiors in

the country.
It has been part of the Campaign's mission for the past 45 years to save Britain's rich heritage of pubs as well as promote real ale.



The 280 pubs in the UK still with little altered interiors were featured in 'CAMRA's Britain's Best Real Heritage Pubs' published in 2013. Criteria for inclusion is that a pub is wholly or largely intact since before 1939; with plan-form unaltered or almost unaltered and most, if not all, the fixtures and fittings surviving before WWII.

This is the first of a series of articles about the least altered pubs interior-wise in Shropshire and features the most impressive of the county's 'Real Heritage Pubs' – The Loggerheads in Shrewsbury.

This is a wonderful unspoilt pub right in the heart of Shrewsbury-its interest lies in a series of four separate rooms so that it looks much as it would have done a hundred years ago. The white-painted three-storey building dates back to the C18 with a single-storey extension of the late 19th or early 20th century housing the lounge bar. It was purchased by Banks's (now Marston's) brewery in 1994 who have taken good care of it including spending some £1/4 million in 2008 (the pub closed for 8 months) to stop it leaning further!

The left hand door leads to an uneven brick-floored passageway with a serving

hatch on the right. To the left is the Gentlemen's Bar (now an outlawed feature of pub life) formed by a timber partition with an iron stay attached to a ceiling beam and borrowed glazing along the top. The



partition acts as a bare high backed settle and the exterior wall is lined with reused C16 oak panelling with bench seating attached. This splendid small quarry tiled room retains an old 'Smoke Room' etched window and has an early 20th-century brick inglenook-style fireplace across the corner with bracketed shelf above. There are some old (non-working) bell pushes still in place and a slate shove ha'penny table is always available for play.

The tiny front bar has a counter of some years provenance and an old mirrored bar back with a more modern lower section, although there were some changes in 2008 following the structural repairs but essential what was there was mainly put back. This homely room contains a plain timber dado, a small cast fireplace and two benches which are of no great age.

At the rear left is the tiny snug / 'Poet's Corner' with a red quarry tiled floor and brown painted plaster walls with wooden frames to give the effect of panelling. It has old padded bench seating all around the room, a small cast-iron fireplace that may be of some age and just two tables.



The corridor runs around the back of the servery to the lounge bar that was last refurbished in the 1930s. It has a parquet floor, fixed seating on two sides with panelling above it (but no sign of bell pushes), a brick fireplace and service from a hatch to the side of the servery, all the fittings dating from the 1930s.



Originally called the Greyhound, by 1828 it had changed its name to the Shrewsbury Arms. The pub sign depicts the heraldic arms of Shrewsbury featuring three leopard's heads. This led to the pub getting a nickname of the Loggerheads, which over time has become its permanent name. In 2008 Banks's inadvertently caused a local media storm by replacing the pub sign. The new one featured the picture of a loggerhead turtle, totally unrelated to the well-documented history of the pub. Fortunately the brewery saw sense and replaced it, the 'turtle' sign now hangs on the corridor wall as a memento of this time.
